


LANDS HOPE SOUTH AFRICA

The Land of Hope Trust project was established in 2007. The aim? To produce and sell a premium range of wines, 50% of the profits of which go into the Land of Hope Trust, the direct and sole beneficiaries being the previously disadvantaged individual employees of Radford Dale, their children and dependents.

THE WHY

The primary objective of the trust is **educational**.

The Trust is making it possible to send our children to schools we could only dream about when we were young, which under apartheid we were not allowed to attend, and which will give our next generation the intellectual ability and the expertise to ensure the positive evolution of our economy our democracy and our community.

Without LoH funding, the children would have no choice but to attend South

African state-run schools.

The OECD (Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development) in 2021 found that almost half (46%) of state-school learners in SA did not achieve the academic results to matriculate (graduate) from secondary school.

The state school system in South Africa is in terminal decay and a generation of African children will miss out on a life of opportunity and instead be faced with illiteracy, innumeracy, poverty and crime.

That is why our Trust is so important, as it makes absolutely certain that the children of our own community receive the best possible education and enter adult life as equals to the privileged few who benefit from first world standards.

THE HOW

Structure of the Trust

- The Trust benefits solely the PDIs, their children and dependants.
- The Land of Hope Trademark and Brand Equity belong 50% to The Trust and 50% to Radford Dale (the latter being the production partner and financer of the wines, operating under an independently-audited memorandum of agreement).
- The board of trustees is comprised of 2 PDI employees, 2 Directors of Radford Dale (including one further PDI), and an independent Chairman in the person of John Platter.



* Beneficiaries submit their distribution requests in November for the following school year

*Trustees meet in December to review all requests

*Trustees allocate distributions, taking budget into consideration

*At least 3 trustees must approve each request

*Invoices are submitted and reviewed against approved allocations before payment is made.

Distributions are primarily for:

- School and Tuition fees
- Aftercare
- Uniforms
- Stationery
- Sport & Development Skills
- Transport (in rural areas)
- Speech therapy and remedial support
- The trust has also assisted with funding for medical emergencies and housing support






From start to finish, all the PDI employees are involved in picking the grapes, making the wine, bottling, branding, selling and shipping it.

When it comes to production the Land of Hope range, *they* call the shots.







Land of Hope grapes are picked by hand and the wines are made as naturally as possible using minimal intervention, in the same philosophy as Radford Dale wines.

We take care to select vineyards and sites from all over the Western Cape which would best suit the style of wine we want to make. All Land of Hope wines are produced from sustainable agriculture. We are fully accredited for environmental, ethical, and social-upliftment practices.

From 2022, we are excited to be adding our very first certified ORGANIC wines to the range.

Land of Hope Reserve Chenin Blanc

Stellenbosch

Rooted in ancient decomposed granitic soils, this Chenin Blanc is from a single vineyard on an ocean-facing slope of the Helderberg Mountain in Stellenbosch. This wine shows both the exuberance of the variety in its floral notes and its nobility in a compelling mineral acidity, naturally bestowed by the site in which it is grown.

Balanced and poised, it provides just enough richness to please the palate and just the right amount of zing to refresh.



Land of Hope Reserve Pinot Noir

Hemel-en-Aarde valley

These grapes come from two adjacent vineyards of Burgundian clones 115 and 777 in the Hemel en Aarde Valley. This region grows vines which produce high quality Pinot Noir grapes, which means the wine has more depth and texture as well as presence and poise.

Whole berry fermentation lifts the aromatics while also bringing supple tannins and length. Dark red fruit and subtle earthiness can be detected. This is not a Pinot for those who think that a good red wine must be black, oaky and full of tannins. This is a fragrant, bright and refreshing Pinot with wonderful succulence, expressive fruitiness and is full of character.



Land of Hope Reserve Cabernet Sauvignon Stellenbosch

This wine is from a single vineyard, rooted in magnificent decomposed granite & clay soils on the Helderberg Mountain in Stellenbosch. These ocean-facing vines produce some of the most complex fruit and individual flavours of the land, combining the geological and climatic uniqueness of this site.

This Cabernet Sauvignon has depth and fullness with a plush and rounded structure and at the same has the restraint to remain elegantly poised. Amazing fruit purity in the shape of an expressive blueberry note rewards and intrigues. This is a natural interpretation of our site, on our spot land where we live and raise our children – and our fruit.

THE CLASSIC RANGE









Land of Hope Chardonnay Stellenbosch & Robertson

Two exceptional sites are employed to create a striking example of this most noble variety. The Stellenbosch component grows on a south facing slope a mere 4 kilometers from the ocean. In the summer months fresh South Easterly winds keep daytime temperatures down so that grapes ripen slowly and evenly. From a wonderful vineyard in Stanford comes the second component, which expresses its origin through an interesting minerality and snappy acidity.

These vineyards were expressly chosen to complement each other and combine to produce a wine of elegance and purity of fruit as well as depth and character.



Land of Hope **Syrah**Stellenbosch

Two mature, trellised, mountainside vineyards, planted with a variety of clones produce this Syrah. Overlooking False Bay, the vines enjoy the cooling influence of the famous Cape Doctor (the prevailing South Easterly wind during summertime). The rocky, gravelly nature of the soil promotes the production of balanced, finely textured wines which show restrained fruit and interesting spice and fynbos notes.

In an age where Syrah is known for making big, polished and powerful, often sweet fruited wines, we have chosen the path less travelled by showing a restrained and subtle expression of one of the Cape's most exciting varieties.
